### WSPTA Legislative Platform

- A two-year platform to mirror the Washington state legislative cycle.
- In the even-numbered years, the new platform is voted on by members at the legislative assembly in the fall.
  - The top five issues become our short-term platform and consist of our priority issues when advocating throughout the year.
     Other issues are placed on an "also supported" list.
- During the odd-numbered years, members vote to amend current issues or to add new, emerging issues to the also supported list. Each issue has a corresponding handout located in the dropdown that can be downloaded and used when advocating.

#### 2023 Session – How did we do?

WSPTA Priority	Outcome
Addressing the <b>Student Mental Health</b> Crisis	Bills passed increasing the pool of mental health workers (residency, educational stipends, new class of supports specialists, peer support training)
Addressing Critical Gaps in <b>Education Funding</b>	Significant funding increase for special education: Raised cap from 13.5% to 15%, increased multiplier, increased special passengers pool
Preventing and Reducing <b>Gun</b> Violence and Suicide	10-day waiting period, school districts must disseminate safe storage (medications & firearms)info, ban on assault weapons, money for enforcement
Addressing Funding, Inclusion, and Supports in <b>Special Education</b>	See education funding above, plus money for teacher training (university)
Building and Maintaining Safer School Facilities	Seismic safety grants and continuing risk assessments
